Methods for Clean-up:	Evacuate personnel to safe areas. Ventilate closed spaces before entering. Do not touch or walk through spilled material. Stop leak if you can do it without risk. A vapor suppressing foam may be used to reduce vapors. Prevent entry into waterways, sewers, basements or confined areas. Absorb or cover with an inert absorbent. Dispose of solid waste according to local, state and federal regulations.

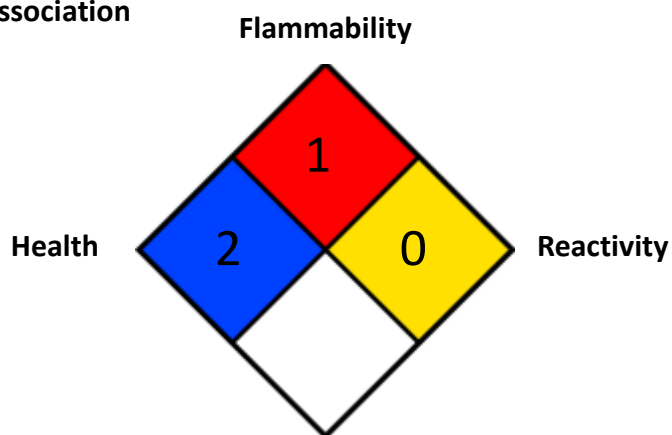
